What is the ADM Board's purpose in Summit County?



The ADM Board's Purpose Statement

The County of Summit ADM Board exists so that: a full continuum of care supports mental wellness and freedom from addiction.

The County of Summit ADM Board is responsible for planning, funding, monitoring, and evaluating treatment, prevention, and support services for people who experience or are at risk for alcoholism, substance use, and mental health disorders. Services are available to any county resident, regardless of ability to pay.



The ADM Board's partner agencies respond to the needs of our community and regularly develop programming to address those needs. Visit the ADM Board's website, admboard.org, for the most up-to-date version of this guide.

ADM Board-Funded Services

- **Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment** is designed to address mental disorders affecting the brain and leading to an inability to control substance use, including drugs or alcohol. Medication-assisted treatment (MAT), such as methadone, suboxone, or vivitrol, maybe used as part of SUD treatment.
- **Mental Health (MH) Treatment** targets conditions that affect mood, thinking, and behavior. Examples of mental health disorders that are often identified and addressed through treatment include depression, anxiety, and schizophrenia.
- **Co-Occurring Disorders (COD)** describes when someone with a mental illness is also experiencing an SUD. Because these disorders may occur simultaneously, they are described as “co-occurring.”
- **Recovery Housing** provides a transitional living environment that promotes sobriety and independent living during the early stages of recovery.
- **Peer Recovery Support** uses individuals with lived experience who are in recovery themselves to help those in recovery engage in activities that promote self-determination, self-advocacy, well-being, and independence. These certified individuals are the backbone of peer recovery support services.
- **Mobile Response Stabilization Services (MRSS)** serve youth and young adults up to 21 years old who may be experiencing difficulties or distress. Safety assessments, de-escalation, peer support, and skill building are examples of the services and supports available to help these youths and their families.
- **Supportive Living** allows individuals who may have mental health disorders or disabilities to gain independence in a living community through support from peers, family, and other advocates.
- **Adult Care Facilities** provide care in congregate settings to those who may need mental health services with services varying from resident to resident.
- **Youth and Adult Respite Services** provide short-term arrangements, such as accommodations and additional caregiver support, to primary caregivers of those with mental disorders or disabilities.
- **Prevention** is a valuable investment for the purposes of stopping or reducing the impact of mental illness and/or addiction disorders. The prevention efforts of the ADM Board focus on building awareness, reducing risk, and reinforcing protective factors.
- **Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT)** is a court-ordered program that provides mental health services.
- **Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC)** is a specially designated clinic that provides a comprehensive range of mental health and substance use services to anyone, regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay.
- **Recovery Community Organization (RCO)** is an independent, non-profit organization led and governed by representatives of local communities of recovery, focused on providing peer-based recovery support services, promoting public education, and advocating for policy changes to support long-term recovery.
- **Intensive Home-based Treatment (IHBT)** integrates core mental health services (community psychiatric supportive treatment, behavioral health counseling and therapy, mental health assessment and crisis response) into one seamless service. Service is flexibly delivered at a time that is convenient for the entire family and is available around the clock. Services are provided in the home, school, and community where adolescents live.

The Summit County Outreach Team (SCOUT) consists of a licensed behavioral health worker, a law enforcement officer, and a paramedic. Team members are trained to identify and de-escalate mental health crises when emergency services are dispatched.
